Grammaire : éléments de syntaxe à retenir

Pour décrire une scène et ce qui se passe à ce moment là précisément:

Le présent BE+V-ING

Ferris is lying to his parents. He isn't telling the truth.

Pour dire ce que l'on veut que quelqu'un d'autre fasse :

(to) want + GN Complément + TO + BV

Ferris wants his parents to believe him.

The sister doesn't want the parents to believe him.
