Moose are cute<sup>1</sup> in cartoons and books, but in real life, they can be dangerous.

These animals are very tall (2.3m) and they weigh<sup>2</sup> over 600kg. Males have very big **antlers**<sup>3</sup> that can be 2 meters long.

Moose like cold weather. They live in areas with cold, snowy winters, including North America, Europe, and Asia.

Moose are herbivores.

During the summer, they eat tall grasses<sup>4</sup> and bushes<sup>5</sup>. In winter, they eat roots<sup>6</sup> and pinecones<sup>7</sup>.

Moose have **hoofed feet**<sup>8</sup>, long legs, **thick brown fur**<sup>9</sup>, a large body, a **small tail**<sup>10</sup>, and a **droopy nose**.

## Les chevaliers de la Table ronde

### Le roi Arthur

Ce personnage a vraiment vécu au V<sup>e</sup> (5<sup>e</sup>) siècle en Grande-Bretagne. Mais au XII<sup>e</sup> (12<sup>e</sup>) siècle, un écrivain français a réinventé la vie du roi. Dans son histoire, Arthur est marié à la belle Guenièvre. Armé de son épée Excalibur, il vit des aventures fantastiques avec ses compagnons, les chevaliers de la Table ronde.

### La Table ronde et ses chevaliers

Le roi Arthur est entouré des meilleurs chevaliers du royaume : Perceval, Gauvain, Lancelot, Galaad... Ils se réunissent autour d'une table magique : la Table ronde. Ils combattent ensemble pour défendre le royaume contre des envahisseurs. Ils sont unis comme des frères.

### À la recherche du Graal

Arthur et ses chevaliers sont à la recherche d'un objet magique : le Graal. D'après la légende, cette coupe a recueilli le sang de Jésus-Christ lorsqu'il a été tué sur la croix.

### Des légendes celtiques

L'histoire des chevaliers de la Table ronde est une légende celtique. Les Celtes sont le peuple qui vivait au début du Moyen Âge en Grande-Bretagne, en Irlande et en Bretagne.

### Des fées et des sorciers

Les chevaliers d'Arthur sont parfois aidés par des fées, comme Morgane et Viviane, ou par de puissants sorciers, comme Merlin.

Personnage légendaire issu des romances du Moyen Âge, Arthur Pendragon serait né vers 470 à Tintagel (Angleterre) et mort vers 535 à Camlann (Royaume-Uni). Il aurait vécu aux V-VI<sup>ème</sup> siècle.

Selon la légende, il est le seul chevalier qui arriva à extraire l'épée **Excalibur** de la pierre dans laquelle elle se trouvait enfoncée, ce qui a légitimé son nouveau statut de roi des Bretons.

Il laissera l'image d'un leader courageux et généreux, qui savait aussi faire régner l'égalité entre ses chevaliers.

Le roi Arthur est mortellement blessé à la bataille de Camlann, qu'il menait contre les forces de Mordred.

Son histoire et son entourage - entre **les chevaliers de la Table Ronde**, sa **reine Guenièvre**, **Lancelot du lac** et **Merlin** - est connu de tous.

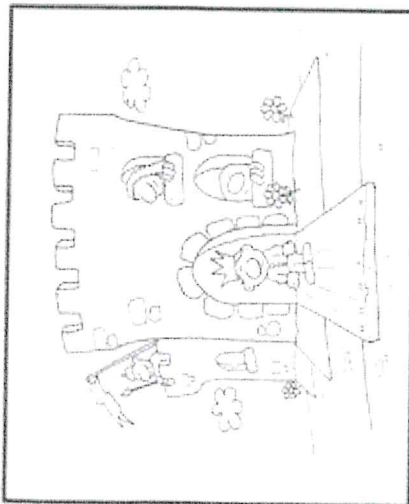
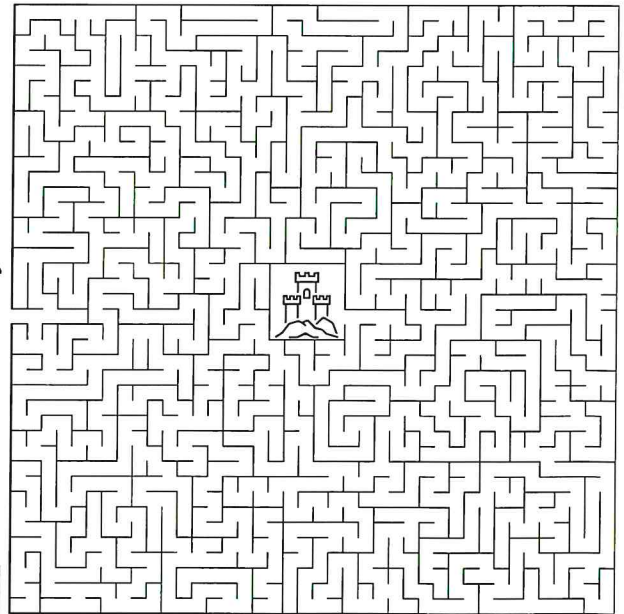

\* Dot painting is made up of small dots of paint colors like **yellow** (representing the sun), **brown** (the soil), **red** (desert sand) and **white** (the clouds and the sky).

\* These are **traditional Aboriginal colors**. Dot paintings can be painted on anything, including on **rocks**, in caves, etc. The paintings were mostly images of animals or lakes, and the Dreamtime.

# The hongigi



The traditional Māori greeting<sup>1</sup> is called the **Hongi**.

Two people touch their noses and foreheads<sup>2</sup> together at the same time.

During the Hongi, the ha – or breath<sup>3</sup> of life – is exchanged between the two people. They share the same moment and the same breath.

# Ta Moko



“Ta Moko” means *tattoo art* in Māori.

These tattoos can cover the face and are a symbol of **social status, power and prestige** for the Maori people.

Ta Moko is a **visual language** which connects the person to his “whakapapa”, his family.

Ta Moko is beautiful but ferocious because they must frighten (*faire peur*) their enemies.
